

At the Providence regional, the team placed fourth. Rising junior **Mitchell Allender** placed among the top five individuals from non-advancing teams and represented Providence in the state finals at The Legends Golf Club in Franklin, Ind. The varsity baseball team finished its season with an 18-9 record and won its seventh sectional title in the last 10 years, beating Henryville and Eastern (Pekin). The team won four games against ranked opponents this season and our pitchers had a team ERA of 2.82.

The JV team finished 12-3 with wins against Jeffersonville, New Albany, Floyd Central, and St. X high schools.

SOFTBALL SEASON WRAP UP

The softball team made history this season by winning the program's first ever back-to-back sectional championship by defeating Eastern Pekin 19-2 in the finals. As winners of the sectional, the Pioneers were able to host regional, which was the first post-season softball game to be played at Providence. The team won 14-4 and advanced to semi-state, where they lost to No. 1 ranked Evansville Mater Dei, 6-0.

Overall, the team won 22 games, which is one game shy of the single-season record for wins in a season (made in 2005). The team will return seven starters in 2014 in an effort to get back to semi-state and beyond.

The Pioneer Softball program also had some post-season honors with **Morgan Boone '13** being named to Academic All State by the Indiana Coaches of Girls Sports Association (ICGSA). Morgan and teammate

Meredith Endris '13 were named to the 2A Indiana Elite All-Star South team while rising seniors **Jordyn Stengel** and **Sierra Collett** were named to the junior edition of the same event. The game will be played on Saturday, June 15, at Westfield High School in northern Indianapolis. Coach Payne will coach the Senior 2A South team.

STUDENTS ATTEND YOUTH SUMMIT

Forty students from all over the state of Indiana were invited by the Indiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence to attend the Teen Summit on Friday, June 7, in Indianapolis. Several students were selected from Providence to attend the summit because of our work with the Green Dot club, which is a club whose goal is to encourage students to stand up in situations involving any form of domestic violence. The youth summit was an amazing experience; I not only learned more about domestic and relationship violence and how to prevent it from happening, but I met many amazing people. We even had the chance to talk with an Indiana state senator to discuss with him the effectiveness of Heather's Law and what further steps the state should take to help prevent domestic violence in our schools.

LOCKER ROOMS UNDERGO EXTREME MAKEOVER

Two Providence athletic facilities under went extreme makeovers last week. The girls'

athletic lockers that are home to PHS volleyball and basketball teams had new wooden lockers installed thanks to



a generous donation by **Brian '87 and Sarah (Buschemeyer '87) Koetter** and Koetter Woodworking. A huge debt of gratitude goes out to the Koettters along with Girls Basketball coaches Brad Burden and **Greg Ash** and **Mr. Toby Wright**, who put many man hours into the completion of the project. Thanks also to rising seniors **Matt Hickey** and **Conner Johnson** for their help in removal of the old lockers.

This work completed phase two of the locker remodel. Phase one was completed two years ago and featured new paint, signs, white boards and logo mats. "PHS Volleyball and Girls Basketball now have one of, if not the best, locker rooms in Southern Indiana."



During the same time period, the weight room underwent a major renovation as well. Old items that were either broken or did not serve a function for our student athletes were removed or sold. New equipment was purchased and the entire facility was cleaned and freshly painted. Each of the sports teams, the PE Department and the PHS Booster Club all contributed funds to this project.

TEACHERS RETIRING

Ms. Nancy Miller taught British Literature at Providence for nearly 20 years starting in 1994. She also taught freshman and senior English classes as well as served as junior class sponsor, National Honor Society sponsor, and English Department chairperson over that time. She also took a number of student groups on summer trips to the British Isles.



Ms. Miller said she decided to retire because the youngest of her four daughters (**Whitney '02, Morgan '06, Taylor '08, and Shelby '09 Miller-Brengle**) has graduated from college and she wanted to be able to "enjoy my retirement by doing it now." She plans to catch up on her reading, travel, and help plan her daughter Morgan's wedding.

She began teaching in 1977 and taught in public schools and as an adjunct professor at Indiana University Southeast. She said she enjoyed teaching at Providence because it gave her a chance to know most of the students and

her colleagues, something she couldn't do in larger schools. She also found it rewarding to see students make progress in their work. "It's always fun when kids respond to a piece of literature that they never expected to like," she said.



Ms. Carol Hocker taught all levels of English at Providence beginning in 2001. She served as junior class sponsor, assisted with After Prom, Powder Puff and Winter Homecoming, and most recently was director of the House of Humility.

Her teaching career began in 1974, and she taught in public, private and Catholic schools from junior high to college, including as an adjunct professor at IU Southeast. Ms. Hocker said she decided to retire because she wants to spend more time with her family, including her aging mother; her new granddaughter, who lives in Paris; and her daughter, who is getting married in Atlanta. She plans to spend time with her family, travel, "read real books," and in the future possibly tutor or teach somewhere part-time.

Hocker said she has enjoyed teaching and sharing her love of literature with students, but she has not found the shift to new technology as rewarding. "It's a good time for somebody new to come in because teaching has just changed so much," she said.

Ms. Jude Manning will move to part-time after teaching at Providence for 30 years and 42 years over all. She will teach AP European History and AP U.S. History for the 2013-2014 school year. During her time at Providence, she taught social studies and theology including Intro to World History, Honors World History, and Social Justice. She also served as tennis coach, junior class moderator and Social Studies Department chairperson.



Ms. Manning said she has loved teaching and getting to know the students, especially those who returned to as teachers in their own right. "I've been very blessed," she said. "God wanted me to be here. That's clear to me for lots of different reasons."

She is unsure how long she will continue to teach part time but plans to continue "as long as I'm effective," she said. The *Judith Manning Social Studies Award* was created this year in her honor, and its first recipient was **Emily Welch '13**.



Other teachers not returning

Ms. Justine Primavera is leaving Providence after teaching math for six years here. She taught all levels of math from eighth grade algebra to pre-calculus and served as House Director for the House of Honesty and most recently the House of Spirit. She also was a faculty leader on several senior retreats.

Ms. Primavera began teaching here when her son, **Nick '10**, was a sophomore. Her daughter, **Alison**, just graduated. She will be teaching math at New Albany High School and said she will miss Providence, especially "the other teachers, the atmosphere and just the bond that there is here."



Other teachers leaving include **Mr. Jake Willard**, who taught theology and was assistant Girls Basketball coach for one year and will pursue a degree in sports management, and **Ms. Jeanne Portman**, who taught French part time for one year.

BLUE NEWS - OF OLD

*Archivists live in constant fear of incomplete research! The primary tool used to research the history of the Norma Reynolds Chemistry Award for the May 22, 2013 issue of e-VISION was a collection of past commencement programs. Thus, it appeared the award was first presented in 2005. I've since learned the award dates back to 1990 but it has only appeared in the commencement program since 2005. Consequently, 21 student recipients were omitted from the original story. Those names - and additional historical information from **Mr. Scott Hutchins '91** and one of our past parents - are now included in the revised feature below - reprinted in its entirety, for posterity's sake.*

The Norma Reynolds Chemistry Award

Ms. Norma Reynolds served Providence for 21 years (1968 through 1989) as teacher of chemistry, physics and biology. The chemistry award named in her honor was established in 1990 and has been awarded annually ever since.

The Norma Reynolds Chemistry Award was created by then-science teacher **Mrs. Ava Prebys** (who taught at Providence from 1978 through 1997) one year after Ms. Reynolds retired.



Current science teacher and assistant principal Mr. Scott Hutchins '91 recalls Mrs. Prebys saying, "The only thing I ask of you is that you continue to give the Norma Reynolds Award." Mr. Hutchins said it was very important to Mrs. Prebys and that he proudly continues the award tradition. A plaque containing the names of all recipients hangs in the Chemistry/Physics Lab. **Patrick Burton '03** said the recipients often referred to the award as "The Norma."

Ms. Reynolds was an extremely dedicated and highly respected teacher of science who impacted students for more than two decades. Upon learning of her death on Jan. 23, 2009, **Ken "K.W." Miller '83** wrote a tribute to Ms. Reynolds entitled "That wonderful and exquisite lady from Physics class!" A portion of that document is quoted here.

I graduated from Our Lady of Providence High School in Clarksville, Indiana, in 1983. I had been a student of Norma's in both Chemistry and Physics. Both difficult classes and part of the honors program. Yet as hard as they were at times, she made them entertaining, enlightening and some of my most treasured memories. Her ability and excitement to teach - to truly entice a student into delving inside material and ferreting out a morsel of understanding - is etched permanently in the fibers of who I am. It was more than just a science lab. It was her lessons of life peppered in between the elements of the periodic table and $e=mc^2$ that elevated our consciousness. Her example is still one I apply and think of when I confront any hurdle. And as I ask myself "What would Norma do," I still hear her voice telling me, "Don't just sit there like a bump on a pickle!"

I've had the fortunate blessings of living the life I always dreamed of. It comes down to all the wonderful individuals who supported and taught me to try and to believe and to ask and to try again. And as I sit here writing this, I am reminded of that wonderful and exquisite lady from Physics class who did just the same. Norma is still teaching - and I will never forget. And I still, to this day, look at pickles in a whole different light.
